Short History of MK Irish FC

On June 1st 2020 the club was formed when Milton Keynes Robins, Unite MK and Milton Keynes Irish Veterans joined together to operate as one club going into the 2020/21 season, Milton Keynes Irish FC! The first team playing at Step 6 in the Spartan South Midlands Division One, the newly formed reserve team playing in the UCL Reserve Division and the Veterans playing in the Veterans League Division One. There are also an adult team in the Milton Keynes Sunday League.

Our first season as a club was unfortunately brought to an early finish due to the effects of COVID-19. The 2020/21 season was looking to be very promising as we found the first team sitting second in the table after 9 games played with the best PPG in the league and went on an exciting run in the FA Vase which saw us get knocked out in the 3rd round on penalties after advancing through 4 rounds beating three higher league opposition.

The season was officially curtailed, however due to performances under Milton Keynes Robins, the club earned promotion to the Spartan South Midlands Premier Division (Step 5) based on PPG over the previous 2 seasons.

2021 also saw the addition of an U18 Floodlit team (run by MK College under the Adopt a Team Scheme) and another 5 youth teams who came over to join under the MK Irish banner from Scot FC, increasing the number of teams to 11, another 2 youth teams were added in 2022.



EVERY season there are stories that stop you in your tracks and aren't forgotten. Often they come with a message that transcends well beyond the 90 minutes of action we are usually discussing. This month football had just that following the scary scenes seen at Chippenham Town in their National League South match with Chelmsford City when Pablo Martinez collapsed. For the Bluebirds chairman Neil Blackmore, the story has a simple reminder for clubs and all sport facilities – make sure you have a defibrillator for that situation you hope will never happen. Like many clubs, Chippenham have the life-saving piece of equipment. Never did they expect to use it – especially on one of their own players. But during the first half of their recent game with the Clarets, it became very apparent something was wrong when 21-year-old Martinez went down. “It was a real shock – you just don't expect to see it,” Blackmore told The NLP. I've been in football for a number of years and seen quite a lot of injuries. Broken legs, dislocated joints, cuts and things like that. As bad as they can be at the time, none of them are ever life threatening – or very rarely. “But to see the club's doctor knelt over him doing CPR is really shocking and hopefully we never see it again. “The way everybody reacted was fantastic. He collapsed and straightaway the physio and a team-mate, who is first aid trained, came onto the pitch and turned him over. Anton, the physio, said, ‘He's stopped breathing’. Straightaway they started CPR. Our club doctor and paramedic ran on – a they got the defib out and gave him a shock and he came round first time. “The emergency services were fantastic too. Literally within minutes we had two ambulances and a rapid responder and a few minutes later an air ambulance landed. I can't praise them highly enough. “By the time he left in a land ambulance he was sat up and gave us a wave. He actually said to the doctor from the helicopter, ‘Will I be OK to play on Tuesday?’” Of course, that game came a bit too soon for the former Bristol Rovers defender but he was due to be fitted with an ICD (Implantable Cardioverter Defibrillator) like Denmark international Christian Eriksen and hopes are he will play again. The fact this is a good news story is down to a lot of people. When the medical process swings into action, there can be positive outcomes. And Blackmore said it has hit home quite how important a defibrillator is. “It sits in the cupboard and it comes out once a year to be serviced,” he said. “You don't think you're ever going to use it. That day you need it, you can't put a value on it. It saved Pablo's life. “I would say to everyone, it doesn't matter if you're a sports club or not, if you haven't got access to a defib, please get one. Get some funding, get some sponsorship, get yourself a defib. They are really easy to use and hopefully it will sit in your cupboard and never be used. But that day you need it, it's an amazing piece of medical kit.”

Match Report FA Vase 27 August 2022

MK Irish are through to the Second Round qualifying of The FA Vase after a 1-0 victory over Arlesey Town at Manor Fields on Saturday.

A bright start was made by the home side but chances were few and far between before Ollie Coleman's fantastic finish from outside the area, midway through the first half, broke the deadlock and eventually secured victory for the Irish. Nimmy Aji broke down the right hand side before cutting the ball back to Ryan Smith on the edge of the box, who cleverly back heeled to the oncoming Coleman who's near post effort beat the keeper to make it 1-0.

Five minutes after opening the scoring, the home side had an opportunity to put the game to bed as Nimmy Aji latched on to a through ball and was racing towards goal, before being cut down in the box just before getting his shot away. The referee pointed to the spot and it was Aji who stepped up to take it, firing over the bar as the chance to double the lead wasn't taken.

Arlesey Town came out fighting in the second half and went close twice in quick succession within five minutes of the restart. First they had the ball in the back of the net after rounding Owusu Kyeremateng and converting, but Irish were saved by the linesman's flag.

Soon after their best chance to equalise came as the visitors went through on goal, before Kyeremateng came out to close the angle and the shot went just wide of the far post.

Kyeremateng was again called into action as an Arlesey Town corner was delivered into the back post, finding an attacker who headed down well, needing a good palm away from the Irish keeper.

MK Irish held firm towards the end of the game and through a long period of additional time, to confirm their place in the hat for the next round of the Vase against another Spartan South Midlands Premier League team on 20 September away vs Aylesbury Vale Dynamos.

A BRIEF HISTORY OF AMERSHAM TOWN FC

Amersham Town FC was formed in 1890. An inaugural meeting took place at the Crown public house, now a hotel, on 10 October 1890. The Chairman was a local headmaster who was very friendly with W. G. Grace and was, in fact, recommended by that great cricketer. Among the original rules were no bad language on the pitch, that no player should wear any nails, an annual subscription of 1/6d (or 7.5p) and an agreement that the club colours would be black and white.

The club originally played at Barn Meadow, down the road from the current ground. Amersham Town moved to Spratleys Meadow in 1920, thanks to the generosity of a local entrepreneur - a Mr Brazil - who founded the famous sausage and pie company bearing his name. Amersham joined the Hellenic League in 1952. The Clubhouse, a former school room, was erected in 1968 and extended to its current size in 1983. In 1998 the Club secured a ninety nine year lease on Spratleys Meadow and installed new floodlights and a new stand. In 2000, new pitches were provided across School Lane for the Youth Section.

In 2006/07 the club enjoyed a major refurbishment. The original changing rooms, which were commandeered in the war as an emergency mortuary in the event of an air raid on Amersham, were demolished and modern facilities constructed. The pitch, which had a slope of 11ft 4 inches from touchline to touchline, was levelled and now provides an excellent playing surface and the clubhouse recently has been comprehensively remodelled. Amersham Town was granted Charter Standard Club status in 2013.
